

Introduction

Stamp collecting is one of the most popular hobbies in the world. A study done in Norway in 1990 indicated that 19 percent of the world's population collect stamps. Many resources are available to get you started on your collection. See p. ? for suggested sources.

Stamps are classified into several categories according to their intended use. The three main categories are:

- ▶ Definitive Stamps are printed in unlimited quantities for specific postal rates and are available for several years.
- Decided the common of the comm
- ▶ Special Stamps include issues that supplement the regular stamps, for example Christmas stamps and "LOVE" stamps.

Instructions

Begin by collecting Norwegian, U.S. and Canadian stamps. Check incoming mail, ask family and friends to save envelopes they receive in the mail and/or correspond with people in Norway, USA and Canada to help build your collection. Ask the people you correspond with to use interesting stamps, and ask long-time collectors if they will share some of their duplicates (extra stamps) with you.

- ▶ Set a minimum goal of 300 different stamps with good representation from all three countries.
- ▶ Organize your collection as it accumulates and protect the stamps so that they don't get damaged or lost. You may use what is called a stock book. It's an album with plastic or paper pockets on each page. Packets of 50 album pages and stamp hinges are readily available for purchase in coin/stamp shops, bookshops, hobby stores, etc. You may also use a three-ring binder and attach your stamps to heavy paper that is punched to fit the binder.
- ▶ Create a dictionary of terms that are unique to stamp collecting. Expand the dictionary as your collection grows.

ORGANIZING YOUR STAMP COLLECTION BY:

STAMP CATEGORIES

As your collection grows, you may want to organize your stamps using the major categories listed below:

- a. Definitive Stamps
- b. Commemorative Stamps
- c. Special Stamps



- d. Airmail Stamps—Stamps for sending mail by air.
- e. Postage-Due Stamps— Stamps indicating that insufficient postage has been affixed to the mailing piece.
- f. Official Stamps—Stamps issued solely for the use of the government departments and officials.
- g. Semi-Postals—Stamps sold at surcharge over postal value. The additional charge is for a special purpose. Usually recognized by the presence of two (often different) values, separated by a "+" sign, on a single stamp.

Starting Your Collection

To Do:

- *1. a.) Pick one of the major categories, see page 1.
- b.) Develop your collection to include 25 stamps from the United States, Canada and Norway in your chosen category for a total of 75 stamps.
- c.) Find out when these stamps were first issued and make a note of that in your album.
- d.) Make copies of the album pages containing the 75 stamps.
 - e.) Attach the copies to your Report Form.
- *2. a.) Select a special topic. See page 1 for examples of topic ideas or identify another topic that is of special interest to you.
- b.) Include at least 30 stamps from your selected special topic, representing each country in your collection, for a minimum total of 10 stamps per country.
- c.) Determine when the stamps were issued and classify them according to whether they are definitive, commemorative or special stamps (see definitions, page 1).
- d.) Make copies of the pages containing approximately 30 stamps.
 - e.) Attach the copies to your Report Form.
- *3. a.) Select one elective activity from page 2 and complete the requirements
- *4. a.) Fill out the Report Form (page 4), ask a lodge officer or designated person to sign as required. Be sure to include the following information:
 - o photocopies of stamp album pages
 - o elective activity requirements
 - o Report Form
 - o Evaluation Form

Elective Activities

- *1. a.) Select three commemorative stamps to represent the USA, Canada and Norway.
- b.) Research the history of the stamps. Write a story about them (suggested length: one page).
- c.) Present your report at your Sons of Norway lodge, in your school or in a community club, or submit your story to the local lodge newsletter for publication.
 - d.) Attach the story to the Report Form.
- ***2.** a.) Select three stamps to represent American, Canadian and Norwegian modern-day life, for example technology.
- b.) Learn as much as you can about the topic and write a story about them (suggested length: one page).
- c.) Present your report at your Sons of Norway lodge, in your school or community club, or submit your story to the local lodge newsletter for publication.
 - d.) Attach your story to the Report Form.
- *3. a.) Read magazines and books that will help you become a knowledgeable stamp collector.
- b.) Join or form a club for collectors in your community. If possible, visit a stamp collectors' store or attend a stamp collectors' convention. (See page 3 for suggested resources.)
- c.) Attach a brief report (suggested length: one page) about your activity.
- *4. a.) Meet with other stamp collectors and form a stamp collecting group.
- b.) Meet monthly (minimum four times to qualify for Norwegian Cultural Skills program Youth Level) to exchange stamps and learn about other collections.
- c.) Attach a brief report (suggested length: one single-spaced page) on your activity.


