Our Mission

The Sons of Norway Foundation is dedicated to funding activities that preserve and promote Norwegian heritage, positively affect members, and make Sons of Norway communities a more vibrant place to live.

Award Amount

The monetary award for this scholarship is up to \$2,000.

Overview

The Orel and Marie Winjum Memorial Scholarship was created to assist with college tuition costs for American citizens of Norwegian and/or German heritage. This scholarship is given in honor of Orel and Marie and Orel Winjum by their children, all of whom earned a college degree - some early in life and some later. Marie finished her college degree after all their children were grown.

Orel and Marie Winjum believed that education is important. They also believed that those who gain the knowledge and critical thinking that a college education can bestow will find their lives truly enriched, and that they will enrich the lives of all with whom they come in contact.

Eligibility

- American citizens with Norwegian and/or German heritage who have applied to or enrolled in an accredited, four-year, post-secondary institution or a two-year community college with the intent of continuing toward an undergraduate degree in the US.
- Those who are 17 or older. Adult students are also encouraged to apply for this opportunity.
- Those who have a grade point average of 2.5 or higher.
- Those who are seeking tuition assistance for the 2020-2021 school year.*

Criteria

- A short autobiography, 150 words or less.
- An essay of 500 words or less addressing each of the following key points:
 - Describe how this scholarship will help you further your career goals.
 - Share why you have chosen your area of study or training and what you hope to through your future career
 - Explain any involvement in volunteer, school and/or community activities and what that involvement has taught you.
 - State how your program/course of study or future plans align with at least one of the following core values of the Foundation: (1) Building the heritage of the future, (2) Sustaining the link to contemporary Norway, (3) Committing to life-long learning and service, (4) Preserving compassion for those in need, (5) Funding innovative individuals and opportunities, (6) Fostering a cohesive community of generosity.
 - Share how your Norwegian and/or German heritage has influenced your life.
 - Explain how you will share this experience with the Sons of Norway or wider audiences.

Orel & Marie Winjum Memorial Scholarship

- Academic potential: Upload your latest completed term's transcripts.

 Please note, "official" transcripts may be required once an applicant is tentatively selected.
- Financial need: Be prepared to include the amount you are able to pay for post-secondary education/training in the online application.
- Letters of Recommendation:
 - Two letters of recommendation that address the applicant's character and abilities.
 - One letter must address the influence your Norwegian and/or German heritage has had on your life.

Application Process

Applications are only accepted via our online portal at www.ShareYourNordic.org.

Award Selection

Final selection of the scholarship winners will be made by a scholarship committee appointed by the Sons of Norway Foundation. Scoring is dependent on the use of complete sentences, proper grammar, and inclusion of information outlined in the essay requirements listed above. Candidates may only receive two Sons of Norway scholarships in a five-year period.

Scholarship Notification and Payment

Notification of an award will be made by email or phone within 14 weeks of the application deadline. Scholarship funding is made payable to the institution listed on the application and mailed to the scholarship recipient.

Recipient Requirements

Scholarship recipients are expected to grant permission to use their photo and name in the Viking magazine, the Foundation's annual report and other scholarship promotional materials. They are also expected to give a presentation, including photos, at their Sons of Norway lodge or one close to them to explain how this scholarship is helping them achieve their educational dreams. We will provide you with a form for a lodge officer to sign after your presentation.
